OUR CENTER

Since opening in 1992, Samaritan Center has served more than 650 families and helped more than 1,850 individuals travel the road back from homelessness.



A 24-hour staff of professionals and administrators is required to effectively run the program and meet the needs of our residents. The Center also relies upon volunteers for the Advisory Board and for day-to-day tasks, such as tutoring, childcare, meal preparation and maintenance. The capacity of Samaritan Center is 26 people, including children, or nine families. All ethnic groups and faiths are welcomed. Residents live in individual family bedrooms in a dormitory-style setting, sharing a large kitchen, living and dining areas and an enclosed play yard.
